What We're Learning

Main Project:

This term, we will continue with our Main Project topic is Maafa, a Swahili word meaning "great disaster". The project will trace the development of the slave trade and explore Britain's role in the transatlantic slave trade, the causes and consequences of the European colonisation of Africa. Children will learn about Africa's rich history and culture, as well as the resilience and strength of African people in the face of adversity.

English

In English this half term, we will be studying chronological, non-chronological and persuasive letters following the theme of our main project topic 'Maafa'. We will be looking at composition e.g layout and tone and grammar that support these genre of text.

Maths

This half term, we will be exploring the topics of abstract maths such as Fractions. Children will continue to develop number sense and should still be working hard at school and at home to practice addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division. To assist your child in their development in this area, we ask that you continue to have them practice times tables, mental math strategies, and reasoning.

History

This half term, we will continue with our project Maafa, in which your child explore Britain's role in the transatlantic slave trade, the causes and the consequences of the European colonisation of Africa and the worldwide communities that make up the African diaspora. They will focus on the abolition of slavery, life after abolition and the lives of black people in Britain today.

Geography

In Geography this half term, your child will explore 'Our Changing World'. This topic allows them to dive deeper into an exploration of the features of Earth including time zones and lines of latitude and longitude. They will use this knowledge to pin point areas on a map. They will then build on this knowledge with a closer look at map features such as lines of topography, map scales, references and the use of Ordinance Survey maps. They will have the opportunity to get hands on with a range of maps and atlases to test these skills.

Science

In Science, children will continue to learn about the circulatory system and how it transports blood throughout the body. They will also learn about the heart and how it functions. Additionally, children will learn about healthy lifestyle choices and how harmful substances can affect the body.

Religious Education

In Religious Education this half term, your child will be learning about different faiths, including Judaism and Hinduism, and about the second coming of Jesus. They will explore scripture and reflect on the promise made. This topic teaches children to develop an awareness of other faiths. Your child will also be learning about Advent. This topic explores why we wait and hope for the second coming of Jesus. Your child will be exploring scripture and reflecting on the promise made.

MFL

In French this term, we will be studying the topic 'What is the Weather'. Your child will learn how to describe the weather in French using nine key phrases. They will use this new knowledge to read and understand a French weather map. The children will also recognise and recall the 9 weather expressions in French from memory, they will be aable to 'ask what the weather is 'today' and give a reply in French. Finally, they will describe the weather in France, in French using a weather map with symbols.

DT

In D.T, children will explore processed food and healthy food choices. This will involve exploring the definitions of healthy, processed and whole foods. They will have the opportunity to differentiate between these definitions in a practical sense by looking at a range of foods. Furthermore, they will have the opportunity to create their own whole foods such as fresh wholemeal bread, pesto and a dish of their own choice. They will devise, plan, execute and evaluate the process of creating their own healthy food.



Music

This half term, your child will have the opportunity to take part in weekly music sessions with the school's specialist music teacher Mr Dixon, in which they will be developing their knowledge of the history of modern music through the topic of 'Blues to the Beetles'.

PE

This half term, your child will have indoor PE every Friday. In these lessons, they will develop their skills in mini volleyball and tennis. Your child will work on specific skills, such as throwing, catching, rolling a ball, weaker hand, aim and control, defending and identify space. They will also apply these skills to game based situations.

PSHE

This half term, we will have representatives from the organisation 'Climate Ed' who will work with your child. The children will learn about climate change and how it affects their future. They will look at the 'The Greenhouse Effect' and will have the opportunity for further research on how they can empower themselves to take action on the issue. This session will be delivered over a five one-hour workshop throughout the term.

Computing

In computing, the children will be introduced to creating website for a chosen purpose by using HTML code. They will identify what makes a good web page and use this information to design and evaluate their own website using Google Sites. Throughout the process, the children will pay specific attention to copyright and fair use of media, the aesthetics of the site, and navigation paths. They will explore and review existing websites and evaluate their content.




Mission Statement
